In 2016, Skyreach then joined forces with Nishio, a Japanese general hire company, to be the combined 8th largest trader within the entire national and international hire & rental industry. Nishio jumping on board marked a significant step in Skyreach's development as a company as they looked to create a larger national footprint.

This venture allowed Skyreach to acquire the industry's leading products and resources, reassuring their customers that they are provided the safest and most technologically advanced equipment the market offers.
